Candidate Forum at Town Hall - March 18

New Identification Requirements for April Election:

In 2009 the Town Council identified that the integrity and administration of Town elections would be well served by implementing identification requirements for voters. A Silverthorne ordinance that outlines acceptable identification documents for Silverthorne was adopted in 2009. Please note that the new election identification requirements will be in effect for the April 6, 2010 election.

Prior to voting, upon arriving at the designated polling place or when requesting an absentee ballot, a voter must produce one of the following forms of identification to the appropriate election official:



- A valid Colorado driver's license
- A valid identification card issued by the Colorado department of revenue
- A valid United States passport
- A valid United States military identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector
- A valid student identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by an institution of higher education in Colorado
- A valid employee identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the United States government or of Colorado, or by any county, municipality, board, authority, or other political subdivision of Colorado
- A valid pilot's license issued by the federal aviation administration or other authorized agency of the United States
